Math Club	Students will practice for competitions and work with interesting and fun math problems
Medical Case Analysis	Interested in Health Science Careers? Analyze History, Physical, Labs, etc. of different medical cases
Multilingual Learner Support Space/First Generation College Support	Support space for first generation college-bound students to receive help with college prep and application process due to their special need status: refugee, undocumented student, or just child of immigrant parents who may be first in their families to graduate high school/college in the US..
Music Appreciation	Students can get exposure to a different genre of music each meeting.
Nat' Business Honor Society	Members of the NBHS will meet monthly to discuss charitable events and build leadership skills.
National Honor Society	Once selected, students will use this time to plan and carry out community service initiatives.
Peer Mediation	Students will receive training to improve upon their own conflict resolution skills as well as some peer mediation techniques. Upon completion of training, mediations can take place.
PTSO	Students will share their vision for activities and fundraising events for the school. Be the Student Voice in the PTSO and take part in the decision making through SPMT, attend meetings and workshops.

Enrichment Wednesdays are an opportunity for everyone at Career to get extra help, study/complete work during the school day, or meet with a club.

All Enrichment Wednesdays have 3 parts:

1. **Classes:** 4 classes meet on Wednesdays for 55 minutes each.
2. **Advisory:** Advisory is 50 minutes on Wednesdays.
3. **Enrichment Time:** Enrichment time is for joining a study hall, an extra help session, or a club for one hour.

Why are we doing this?

Students at Career have been asking for a study hall for years! You have 8 classes, and that's a significant amount of work and studying. We also want students to be able to have time to get extra help or meet with a club, especially because so many students have responsibilities after school and can't stay for club activities.

How do I pick a club/study hall to attend on Wednesday?

Each week, your advisory teacher will ask you what club/study hall you'd like to attend. Your advisory teacher will sign you up for your chosen club/study hall. There is a list of available clubs/study halls inside of this booklet.

Why isn't every club/activity available every week?

There are 2 possibilities:

1. Not every club meets every week. For example, the Drama Club meets on the second and fourth Wednesday of each month. The Anime Club meets on the first and third Wednesday.
2. Clubs and activities will fill up as students sign up for them. To prevent 90 people from signing up for the same study hall, each teacher has a limit for how many students can sign up for their study hall/activity. *This means that you should select a second choice for your study hall/activity in case your first choice fills up!*

Can I make my own club?

Yes! Find a teacher who is available to serve as a club advisor and speak with them about your idea.
