

NCAA Checklist

In order to be declared eligible by the NCAA (National Collegiate Athletic Association) to participate in intercollegiate athletics at a Division I or Division II college, a high school senior must do the following:

___ Register online at <http://web1.ncaa.org/eligibilitycenter> with the NCAA Eligibility Center. Click on **Prospective Student Athletes**, then on **U.S. Students Register Here** (in the blue box).

___ Pay the **Registration Fee (\$60)** as part of registration, or request a **fee waiver** from your guidance counselor. If you used an SAT or ACT fee waiver, the NCAA registration fee can also be waived. You must speak with your guidance counselor in order to have the fee waived. Your registration will not be processed by the Eligibility Center until payment or a fee waiver confirmation from your counselor is received.

___ Complete the **NCAA Amateurism Questionnaire** online. This questionnaire should be made available to you as part of the registration process.

___ Ask your counselor to send your **official high school transcript** to the NCAA Eligibility Center. Your final transcript will also be submitted at the end of your senior year.

___ List the **NCAA code 9999** under "Where to send your scores" when you register for the SAT Reasoning Test. You may add this code through your account on the CollegeBoard website up to one week after you take the SAT.

Division I eligibility is determined by your grade point average (in 16 core courses) and SAT scores according to the NCAA sliding scale (see other side of this sheet).

Division II eligibility is determined by earning a minimum grade point average of 2.0 (C) in the 16 core courses.

Meet with your counselor to check on your eligibility.
