## Career Journalism Class



Career Journalism Students Attend Conference

On October 7th, 30 students in Ms. Murphy's journalism classes participated in a day of workshops, lectures, and speakers at Southern Connecticut State University's High School Journalism Day. High School Journalism Day is an annual conference hosted by SCSU aimed at introducing students to the journalism industry. Alongside over 300 other high school journalists from across Connecticut, Career students engaged in workshops about newswriting, photography, law, ethics, broadcast journalism, and editing before listening to keynote speaker and Emmy award-winning journalist Keisha Grant of NBC Connecticut.

For the Career journalism students, their relationship with SCSU is especially exciting; Career journalism students are enrolled concurrently in NHPS and SCSU through the dual enrollment program. The dual enrollment journalism program allows students to earn three college credits through Southern alongside the high school credit they earn through NHPS. Career is the only high school in the state to offer dual enrollment journalism through SCSU. Last year, 28 Career students earned college credits through the program, which they are now able to transfer to whatever postsecondary institution they attend.










## **A1 DRIVING SCHOOL**
